As much as I enjoyed the readings, they did tend to be really long which made it challenging to finish them some weeks.

At times, I found it hard to speak in class – I guess I would have appreciated more guidance from the Professor when we were having discussions.

I would have liked for the coursework to be more evenly distributed throughout the semester, rather than three main assignments towards the end of the semester.

I don't think it was necessarily her but I just didn't enjoy the way she presented the information in a lecture every class, it wasn't interesting.

I found that a number of students would dominate the class discussion with comments which in my opinion would waste time rather than be helpful. While these students are not the fault of the teacher, more direct facilitation may have been better for this. (granted I also understand this is complicated)

I think she could have incorporate more efforts to make the class engaging. Going through formulaic, text–heavy slides could get tiresome at times. The parts of class that I enjoyed the most were when professor Wilson–McDonald made went on short tangents or incorporated anecdotes from her own personal background knowledge as a scholar. I would additionally say that at times, professor Wilson–McDonald's approach felt slightly surface level. However, I think this class feels like this for me because it is the only non–400/500 level class I've been enrolled in about 5 semesters. One of my sophomore class mates expressed to me that they found the class challenging and its insights revelatory. So, this may just be personal. Overall, I think she could push the class to have more profound discussions.

The only little thing I have is maybe separating the power blog post and the final because it felt like the dates were very close. Maybe having two blog posts with the power one in the middle like a midterm would be better, so it doesn't feel as stressful.

It sometimes felt as though the class discussion was taking over; she could have retained the littlest bit more control of the discussions and guided their course (although I appreciate when professors allow the students to speak freely rather than cutting us off and prioritizing their own speaking, which she did not do at all).

I wish the lectures were more discussion—based. Also I think the reading was helpful but in many cases very lengthy; from what I know a lot of students stopped doing them once they found out that the quizzes weren't 'pop' quizzes.

The last 3 assignments should have been more spread out or broken up into smaller assignments given how close the due dates were.

I think that having three big assignments towards the end of the semester was extremely overwhelming. I think that the power blog post could have been turned into a final, and maybe the book / paper could have been a midterm.

I feel like there was a period with a lot of time to just do readings and no assignments due. But the time between thanksgiving and finals has been a lot stressful!

She left most of the course load for the end of the semester so that we had three large assignments due in the span of two weeks.








Honestly this whole course was super helpful when moving forward into the world after graduation. Developing a research project allowed me to gain more experience in the field I am hoping to go into in the future.




#### **University Core Instructor Evaluation Questions - Aggregate Chart**



- As a student that will be receiving an F for the course, I believe I should state the reasons behind this. I have not been to class for a long time, this is due to me not submitting one paper. To elaborate, we were told in class, by the instructor, that if we did "poorly" on the assignment we would have to get an A on every single assignment afterward to get a passing grade. As a student with many other responsibilities and classes I became completely unmotivated to do my work as my grade on the paper was worse than "poor" but in actuality a zero, to me this ensured my failure of the course. Because of this message, I decided to choose whether getting a D (which meant full commitment and academic excellence in one course for the remaining 2-2 1/2 months just to get not even a passing grade) was worth it, or accepting my F and focusing on bettering my mental health and excelling at my other classes was the better option. My previous statements allude to which decision I made. Additionally, one of the larger assignments for the class was to examine a policy proposal for a country or government official to look over, which should be no problem given my extensive involvement with model UN and previous international politics studies. But to my surprise, my group topic was completely different from my peers. We would be presenting our policy proposal to an executive at Chevron, this completely alters the type of policies able to be proposed and limits the work whoever we are presenting to can do, relating to the policy proposal and their ability to enact laws and pass legislature pertinent to the policy proposal. Furthermore, this completely isolated me and my group partner from peer assistance, as even my friends in this class could not help me differentiate between a policy proposal to a government official, which I believe they all were doing, and a policy proposal to an executive at a business. Finally, to rub salt on the wound the professor reached out, after a month of my absence, to inquire if I would be completing the final project. This leads me to believe that the statement made in October about getting an A on every following assignment if we did poorly on the one just to get a passing grade, was false. Either way, I will retake this course and petition to have the F removed from my transcript, overall though, lecture content was good, assignments were unclear, and grade proportions were misrepresented.
- Dr. Wilson-McDonald displayed great knowledge in the content of the class. I have come out of this course with more knowledge of development and a deeper understanding of the world around me.
- You can tell that Dr. Wilson-McDonald knows a lot about what she is teaching. Sometimes the class can be very uninteresting and very low energy. It seemed there was very little time to focus on the policy project. It was a bit challenging to prepare for the final policy evaluation because we were more focused on response papers, readings, and the presentation.

- I really appreciated assignment feedback. I think it was vital in helping me get back into the swing of things after being out of a classroom for so long.
- My only issue with this class is that I thought the assignments were a little much. I know that this is graduate school, but I found it a little difficult to handle the readings, videos, discussion posts, case study assignment, and ethics journal entry that had to be turned in every week. I put my journal entries off until the end so that I could focus doing well on the assignments. If the ethics journal is still kept for this class, I would advise just making it one page a week and maybe that could be a bit more manageable.
- The amount of time the case studies required each week is not proportional to the case studies portion of the grade.
- The workload in this class is way too much to handle as a full-time graduate student. Through homework, the ethics journal, and the final paper tallied over 100 pages worth of writing, and that is just unsustainable. Consider that if every class asked that much work, it would be nearly 300 pages of writing in a single semester, that would be the equivalent of writing 20 pages a week of assignments and projects.

I understand that this is a graduate level class and it should be more difficult than undergrad, but this was just too much and it caused me to lose focus on my other classes, not to mention the cost of my mental health.
